DESCRIPTION – IN A PARAGRAPH, HOW WOULD YOU DESCRIBE THE PROJECT TO SOMEONE?

Our project, RxPedition, aims to expand GlobalRx's impact by promoting pharmacy awareness and cultural competency through monthly educational meetings, international collaboration, and global health outreach initiatives. We plan to have events and fundraisers to support future travel based learning opportunities, collaborative efforts with other organizations, and to highlight the diversity of healthcare around the world. We want to train the next generation of pharmacists to be both globally aware and culturally competent while serving their community. International collaboration will allow USC students to network with students from all over the world, along with global pharmacy organizations and leaders. This will include learning opportunities through Global Pharmacy Experiences, and zoom meetings with international pharmacy professionals. This project will benefit both students and the institution because it will allow USC to have a good standing on providing a globally minded institution for their pharmacy students. Through these initiatives, we hope to inspire pharmacy students to think globally while serving locally.

WHAT ARE THE FOUR COMPONENTS OF THE PROJECT?

Structural: A consistent meeting schedule for our members on the 1st and 3rd Thursdays of each month. Establishing a fundraising calendar with goals and day deadlines. Reserving rooms for our meetings in advance, and making sure members can easily access the location, including those may be disabled. Create templates for meeting attendance for interviews held to choose participants of GPEs.

Human resources: Encourage officers to plan projects and meetings in advance. Recruit pharmacy students as members who will support our goals and provide them with leadership and networking opportunities. Allow our advisor to lead students and provide guidance for organization expectations. Have designated roles for officers to plan events, fundraisers, and outreach to promote independence and team collaboration.

Political: Look for support on event planning and receive approval from the institution to ensure we are not violating guidelines. Advocate for our organization to prove that we align with the institution's mission by promoting international collaboration and learning opportunities. Prove that international collaboration is beneficial to our students, especially in pharmacy. Engage members in fundraising opportunities and expand fundraiser profits.

Symbolic: Promote Global Pharmacy Association as an organization whose main desire is to have culturally competent healthcare leaders. Celebrate achievements made by both the organization and students when traveling. Highlight the significance of global perspectives when it comes to the world of pharmacy. Show professional growth from our members and the organization. Continue to expand fundraisers and profits to ease costs for USC Mann students and GlobalRx members.

HOW WILL YOU MEASURE SUCCESS?

- Create a template for the number of meetings and fundraisers held each month.
- Track attendance for all meetings and fundraisers to measure the engagement of members.
- Set goals and track progress for fundraisers.
- Hold polls for feedback from our members on how effective our organization was so that we can improve.
- Track how many Global Pharmacy Experiences are held through our organization and member participation.
- Document the number of new global partnerships we achieve through the organization.
- Record how many successful meetings we have with more participation after meeting time conflicts with bigger organizations have been adjusted.
- Measure success with potential CHOSAN collaboration with GlobalRx after approval.
- Set a goal for making GlobalRx a chapter with other pharmacy schools.
- Have Dr. Graham create a biography about how he got to his position at USC Mann.
- Measure the success of collaborating with undergraduate Pre-Pharmacy students at USC.
